7:00 a.m.	Begin set-up for conference <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Registration area & exhibit area• A/V• Posters, patients, microscopes
8:00 a.m.	Registration opens <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Exhibit hall and continental breakfast• Posters and slide viewing open to members throughout the morning
8:30 - 10:00 a.m.	Patient Viewing <i>3 - 5 patients who are carefully selected to be good teaching cases with current illness.</i>
9:00 - 10:00 a.m.	Basic Science Lecture <i>This is what we've been calling the "resident" lecture, but in fact has been open to any member who is interested.</i>
10:00 - 10:30 a.m.	Break in the exhibit area <i>Patient, slides and poster viewing continues</i>
10:30 a.m. - 12:00 p.m.	Resident case presentations and discussion <i>Cases presented verbally should be <u>succinct</u> and clinically relevant. Because they also are written up in the protocol book, it is not necessary to go into a lot of detail when presenting the cases verbally. The format for this segment should allow for <u>discussion</u> and should not turn into a series of mini-lectures. Cases selected for the podium should be geared toward generating discussion. Other cases can be published in the protocol. Keep in mind the total time allocated to case presentations. Dividing that by the number of cases to present will give you the average amount of time available for each case, including discussion.</i>
