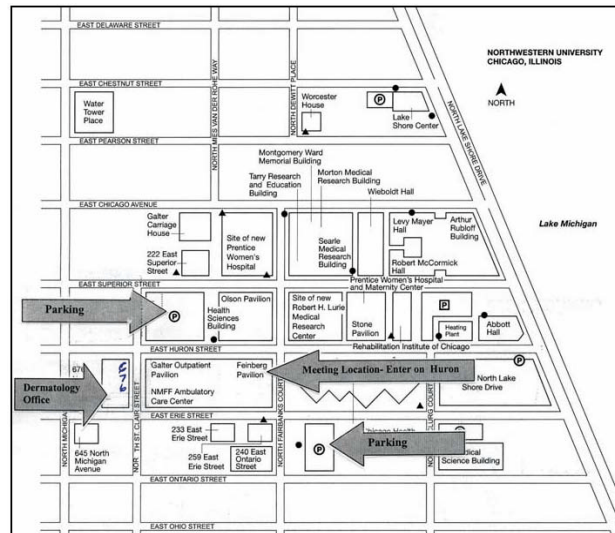
Annual CDS dues includes attendance at the monthly meeting; there is no charge for members in good standing. For non-member guests, the registration fee is \$35.
